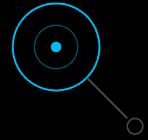

THE EXECUTIVE PROTECTION AGENT · CAPABILITIES BRIEF

Protection built around a person, not a perimeter.

You answer for the safety of someone who cannot always protect themselves — and for everyone and everything around them. That accountability deserves one system, not a patchwork of vendors.

01 THE PROBLEM — PROTECTION AS THEATER

Most executive protection is sold the way guard services are: a body for the event, a driver for the airport run, a name on a call sheet — priced and staffed one engagement at a time. It covers the moment someone remembered to book it, and nothing else. The home goes unwatched between visits. The family is someone else's problem, or no one's. The vehicle, the vacation house, the safe room: bought separately, from separate vendors, none of them talking to each other.

Almost nothing about a threat to a prominent person is sudden. It is preceded by a pattern — an escalation, a warning sign someone was positioned to see and did not, because no one was watching continuously enough to see it form. A protection model built around scheduled events cannot catch any of that. And when something happens between engagements, the report lands on your desk, not the vendor's.

Protection that only shows up when it is scheduled is not protection. It is theater.

02 YOUR GUIDE — A CONCIERGE RELATIONSHIP, NOT A CALL SHEET

We built the Executive Protection Agent for people who answer for outcomes. A licensed capability of the Autonomous Security Force — the same ASF-7 command layer, the same as every machine and analyst in the Force. The same Agent, or the same coordinated team, knows the household's routine, walks the property, drives the car, and is still watching after everyone else has gone home.

Where the broader Force is deployed, Mission Intelligence extends verified, 24/7 monitoring to the principal's location, working from a digital twin mapped before the Agent ever arrives. On the road or at a one-off event, the standard does not move: the same judgment, accountability, and audit trail travel with the Agent. **A bodyguard is a person. This is a capability.**

Discreet. Present, not noticed. The highest compliment an Agent can earn is that no one noticed them working.

Flexible on schedule, firm on safety. The Agent bends around the day, never around the security plan.

Private. Nothing about the principal leaves the detail — not the schedule, not the mood, not the stories.

Plan first. Advance work done before anyone arrives. Comfort is negotiable. Safety is not.

03 YOUR PLAN — THREE STEPS

- 1 Book a briefing.** Tell us who and what you are accountable for: the principal, the family, the home, the assets. No demo, no pitch.
- 2 We architect the protection.** The Agent or coordinated team, the coverage, and the command layer that ties it together — before anyone is assigned.
- 3 The Force takes the watch.** The same Agent stays on the relationship: continuous, not episodic. The gap between engagements closes for good.

04 THE WATCH COVERS

THE PRINCIPAL

Judgment on the move: reading the room, sensing a threat before it announces itself, deciding when to move and when to hold. No checklist replaces it.

THE HOME

Consistent presence, not a scheduled patrol. Perimeter checks, alarm response, staff and visitor vetting — where the principal is most predictable gets the most rigor.

THE FAMILY

The household screened as carefully as the perimeter; warning behavior watched for, not waited on — and the school run handled so the family gets to just be a family.

THE ASSETS & THE MOVE

Vehicles, valuables, and sensitive information covered present or away. The Agent is often the driver: defensive driving, route planning, vehicle checks before every departure.

05 THE STAKES

KEEP THE PATCHWORK

Unwatched gaps between bookings. Warning signs nobody is positioned to see form. Five vendors, zero accountability — and your name on the report.

COMMAND A FORCE

One contract, one command layer, one audit trail. Verified 24/7 monitoring under ASF-7. A protective record you can stand behind — to the board, to counsel, to the principal.

06 TRUST & VERIFICATION

American-owned and controlled. Publicly traded (NASDAQ: KSCP), U.S.-only operations. No foreign parent company.

Licensed and vetted. Every Agent licensed in the state where they serve, screened beyond industry minimums.

Public-company governance. Audited financials, independent board — scrutiny no private guard firm faces.

A career, not a gig. Agents hold equity and full benefits — built to retain the judgment the principal comes to trust.
